

Arrive at the Neil Armstrong Air and Space Museum. Wapakoneta is the hometown of Neil Armstrong, the first person to walk on the moon. This museum takes visitors on a journey through aviation and aerospace history, chronicling Ohio's contributions to the history of space flight.

Our next stop is the WACO Air Museum and Learning Center and WACO Airfield. Exhibits depict the Troy Company's commercial and military aircraft production from the 1920s through WWII. In the 1920s WACO was the largest producer of aircraft in the world.

The National Museum of the United States Air Force is the world's largest and oldest military aviation museum. The museum uses both chronological and subjective layouts to tell the exciting story of aviation development from the days of the Wright Brothers to current stealth technology. The National Aviation Hall of Fame is also located inside the museum. You also won't want to miss the presidential aircraft including Kennedy's Air Force One.

- Cost: Free admission and parking

1:30pm

Arrive at the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park in Dayton. During this visit, you will explore the **Wright Cycle Company** where the Wright brothers built their Wright flyers. In their Dayton, Ohio bicycle shop, they researched and built the world's first power-driven, heavier-than-air machine capable of free, controlled and sustained flight.

-Cost: Free admission

3pm

Carillon Historical Park, home to the Wright Brothers National Museum, celebrates the history of invention, transportation and pioneer life in Dayton and the Miami Valley. In Wright Hall, you will discover the 1905 Wright Flyer III, a National Historic Landmark. The national park unit at Carillon includes a replica of the last Dayton bicycle shop where the brothers worked.
